To Do:

- □ Login to Naviance. Most people will need their Naviance password reset. Ask your school counselor for help if you don't already know your username or password.
 - Complete the Career Interest Profiler, Do What You Are, and Strengths Explorer inventories.
 - Complete the Class of 2021 Senior Profile.
- □ Learn about colleges. Look at college websites or find colleges through the SuperMatch College Search tool on Naviance or on <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>. Talk to friends, family members, teachers, and recent grads who are now in college. List the college features that interest you.
 - Sign up for more information on the college websites that interest you
 - **Participate in Virtual Tours** most colleges are now offering virtual Open Houses and other experiences online
- Develop a list of colleges that are of interest to you. You may find many colleges at which you'll be happy and get a great education. The college search is about exploring who you are and what you want and then finding colleges that will meet your goals.
 - \circ $\;$ Add colleges to your list in Naviance that you are thinking about or planning to apply to.
- About SATs/ACTs: Many colleges are now flexible about their testing policies for the high school class of 2021. You can also check **www.fairtest.org** to see if the schools you are interested in are already test optional. Visit <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> to register for Fall SAT test information.
- □ **Create a Common Application** account and start adding schools to your list. Link your Common App account to Naviance.
- □ **Keep track of College Application Deadlines!** Every college will have a different timeline for applications, so be sure to pay attention to these deadlines, especially if you are going to apply Early Action or Early Decision.
- □ If you are an athlete interested in playing a D1 or D2 sport in college -- Register with the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Eligibility Center (ncaaclearinghouse.net). All prospective college athletes can indicate their interest in playing at the college level on individual college websites.
