School counselors will be scheduling meetings with students to review and finalize course selections.


ATC Applications due by March 17.

- College and Career Ready
- Post-secondary goals
- High School minimum graduation requirements vs. College Admission requirements
- Differences in requirements for certain majors
 - Ex. Nursing Chemistry, Anatomy
 - Ex. Engineering math requirements
- Rigor
- Alternates

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE TAKING CLASSES IN HIGH SCHOOL

Advanced Placement

- Administered through the College Board
- Rigorous, fast paced
- Students take AP exam, qualifying score can earn college credit or advanced standing
- Some courses may require summer assignments



Running Start

- Administered through the Community
 College System of NH
- Additional registration process required to earn college credit (once class starts)
- Rigorous, follows requirements of community college course
- Credit earned upon successful completion


NEW HAMPSHIRE SCHOLARS

College Ready, Work Ready, Ready for Life

- Incentive for students to take rigorous coursework in high school to prepare for college or career
- Prescribed course of study includes 4 social studies credits, 4 math credits (including beyond Algebra 2), 3 lab based sciences, 2 World language courses
- 4 Pathways: NH Scholars, STEM Pathway, Arts Pathway, Career Pathway
- Recognition includes:
 - Recognized with medallion or pin to wear at graduation
 - Indication on transcript/foil seal on diploma

Step 1: Login to PowerSchool at ps.conval.edu/public

Step 2: After logging in, you will be directed to the home screen. Choose the course registration link on the left side of the screen.



Step 3: The class registration page has options organized into categories. These categories indicate details about those classes, such as if the selected one is required, recommended, or optional.





Step 4: To select a course, use the pencil option to see the available options in a given category as well as description information regarding each course. Courses are listed alphabetically.

Check the box in order to select the course. Some categories will allow you to select multiple courses if you so choose.



Step 5: Once you have reviewed each category and made your selections, be sure that you've signed up for enough credits - a full course load is 8 credits.



Step 6: All students should also include 3 alternate choices. These are courses that would be scheduled if one of your top choices is not available.
