



What do we do and why does it matter?

- All of our students will have careers as adults. Some students will get there by attending college first, while others will join the workforce right after high school graduation.
- We introduce students to career options through our career and technical education (CTE) programs and work-based learning (WBL) opportunities.
- We teach students content related to the program they're in (hard skills)as well the employability skills like communication and collaboration that they'll need regardless of where they're employed (soft skills).


College credit through Running Start and articulation agreements

Transition to High School/Course Selection

Course Selection Process

- Review ConVal High School general information with parents/guardians on February 20th (tonight)
- Feb. 21st and 22nd, ConVal counselors visit middle schools re: course selection
- Students complete course selection sheets with their middle school counselors by March 24
 - Meeting with students/inputting course requests into PowerSchool together
- Independent/Charter School Process
 - Thursday, February 23rd Information Session and Tour (6:30 p.m.) If there is bad weather, a new date will be scheduled.
 - Registration information will be made available at that session, and will also be sent to independent schools after that date
 - Kelli Garthe, CVHS Registrar, is the contact person for enrollment (kgarthe@conval.edu)
- May/June 2023 there will be an opportunity for parents/students to visit ConVal
- Schedules are available in early August; New Student Orientation in late-August




