FEB 12 – MARCH 22

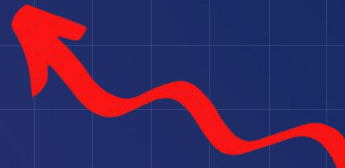
School counselors will be scheduling meetings with students to review and finalize course selections.

Things to Consider

WHEN SELECTING YOUR COURSES

*All students must engage with and apply **English and mathematics competencies** during every year they are in high school*

- Interests should drive course selection
- College and Career Ready
- Post-secondary goals
- High School minimum graduation requirements vs. College Admission requirements
- Differences in requirements for certain majors
 - Ex. Nursing - Chemistry, Anatomy
 - Ex. Engineering - math requirements
- Rigor
- Alternates

Sample College Admissions Requirements

Keene State

- English – 4 credits
- Math – 3 credits
- Science – 3 credits
- Social Studies – 3 credits
- World Lang.– Recommended

Boston College

- English – 4 credits
- Math – 4 credits
- Science – 4 credits
- Soc. Studies – 4 credits
- World Languages – 4 rec.

ConVal Diploma

- English - 4 Credits
- Math - 4 Credits
- Science - 3 Credits
- Social Studies - 3 Credits

AP Level Courses

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE TAKING CLASSES IN HIGH SCHOOL

Advanced Placement (AP)

- Administered through the College Board
- Rigorous, fast paced
- Students take AP exam, qualifying score can earn college credit or advanced standing
- Some courses may require summer assignments



Early College Courses

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE TAKING CLASSES IN HIGH SCHOOL

Early College

- Administered through the Community College System of NH
- **Additional registration process required to earn college credit (once class starts)**
- Rigorous, follows requirements of community college course
- Credit earned upon successful completion

3 ways to do Early College

1. **Early College at ConVal** (formerly known as Running Start courses)
2. **Early College at a community college** campus
3. **Early College Online** (formerly known as eStart)

College Ready, Work Ready, Ready for Life

- Incentive for students to take rigorous coursework in high school to prepare for college or career
- Prescribed course of study includes 4 social studies credits, 4 math credits (Including: Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, and one additional math beyond Algebra 2), 3 lab based sciences, 2 World language courses
- Minimum GPA 3.2
- Recognition includes:
 - Recognized with pin to wear at graduation
 - Indication on transcript/foil seal on diploma

How to select courses in PowerSchool

Step 1: Login to PowerSchool at ps.conval.edu/public

Step 2: After logging in, you will be directed to the home screen. Choose the course registration link on the left side of the screen.



How to select courses in PowerSchool

Step 4: To select a course, use the pencil option to see the available options in a given category as well as description information regarding each course. Courses are listed alphabetically.


